#### Thesis abstract

My thesis explores the role of the soldier on the modern mediated battlefield through the study of videos shot by American troops in Iraq and posted on YouTube. I chose to address specifically three types of military operations filmed by soldiers, emblematic of the exercise of war and recurring on YouTube: encounters between soldiers and civilians, street combat, and military strikes. Through an anthropological, iconological, aesthetic and rhetorical analysis of their productions, my research explores the confrontation, within their footage, between a representation constantly referring to the "complex of visuality" (Mirzoeff) designed by the military and media communication of the war – video games, news reports, war cinema, official discourses and doctrines - and the rough and immediate account of their action on the battlefield. These disruptions reflect the contradictions inherent to their role on the frontline, beyond the military and media communication of a humanitarian, bloodless and riskless conflict. I focus, in the videos of interactions between soldiers and children, on the contradiction between the "responsibility to protect" paradigm of humanitarian intervention and the shifting nature of the enemy in counter-insurgency warfare; in street combat videos, I explore the disruption between the technological supremacy of the soldiers' arsenal and their vulnerability to insurgent attacks; in videos of installation bombings, I examine the transformation of the role of the land forces from direct combatants to spectators of a war show happening at a distance.
